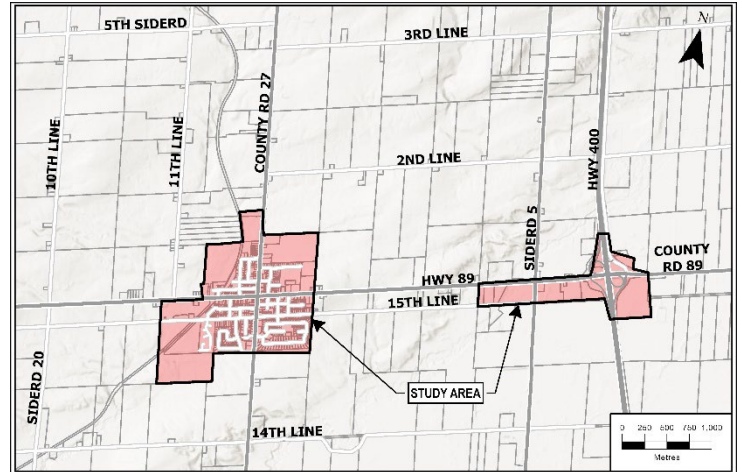


# NOTICE OF COMPLETION



## COOKSTOWN WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

InnServices, the water and wastewater Utility for the Town of Innisfil (Innisfil) undertook a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to identify the most cost effective and environmentally sustainable approach to provide wastewater servicing for the community of Cookstown, as well as the employment, commercial and residential area at Highway 400 and Highway 89. The approximate extent of the study area is shown on the map.



The Study followed Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process, as described in the Municipal Engineers Association guide (February 2024) which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

### Project Status

This Notice of Completion serves as the final mandatory point of public contact. The Environmental Study Report, associated Technical Memoranda and appendices are being placed on public record for a 30-day review period, starting on **September 10, 2026**, and ending on **October 10, 2026**. A Section 16 Order request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e. requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g. require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name for the MECP.

Section 16 Order requests regarding Aboriginal and treaty rights should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or request for an individual / comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the MECP is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
